

# Risk Assessment – Return to School 2 November 2020; COVID-19

This risk assessment takes account of the guidance provided by the government in its Guidance for Full Opening: Schools published on 1 October 2020, to be found at <a href="https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/actions-for-schools-during-the-coronavirus-outbreak/guidance-for-full-opening-schools">https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/actions-for-schools-during-the-coronavirus-outbreak/guidance-for-full-opening-schools</a>. It is reviewed at least every 2 weeks by the Proprietor, Principal and Headmaster. It seeks as a minimum to implement the essential measures set out in Section 1 of the government guidance above. These are:

- The requirement that people who are ill stay at home
- Robust hand and respiratory hygiene
- Enhanced cleaning arrangements
- Active engagement with NHS Test and Trace
- Formal consideration of how to reduce contacts and maximise distancing between those in school wherever possible and minimise potential for contamination so far as is reasonably practicable

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The school has responded to the coronovirus outbreak by adopting a number of general measures to ensure the safety of all members of the school community. These include the following

- 1. Pupils are grouped by year group ("bubbles") and do not have contact with any other bubbles
- 2. Form Teachers only teach within their designated bubble throughout the day
- 3. Specialist staff will cross bubbles, but teach from the front of the class and will only walk around the classroom if wearing a mask or visor.
- 4. Peripatetic staff wear masks or visors when teaching
- 5. All teachers wear masks or visors when in contact with anyone not in his or her bubble.
- 6. All adults are expected to socially distance when talking to other adults
- 7. The school is cleaned at lunchtime and in the evening by professional cleaners.

Our aim is to balance the need to keep all members of the school community as safe as possible while continuing to provide for the pastoral and educational needs of the children. The grid below sets out specific areas where there is a risk of infection spreading and the measures we are taking to mitigate those risks.
