## How can I help at home?

In Year 1 pupils are encouraged to take more responsibility for their belongings and complete homework, spellings, and daily reading. Please encourage your child to take responsibility for packing their own bag, putting on their coat and shoes and ensuring that they have all they need for the day ahead. The children continue to use reading records, which are an excellent communication tool, enabling the class teacher to understand how your child is reading at home. Reading comprehension is an increasing focus, so please do ask your child questions about the story when you read at home. If you would like any guidance for how to actively read with your child, please speak with the class teacher. You can also encourage children to see maths in everyday life, such as counting objects while out shopping, or using footsteps to count forward and back while out and about.
