Pupils will start the year revising hobbies and sports in French. They will continue with learning/revising a broad range of weather. They will link both these topics to various non-European French speaking countries, culminating in writing a report on one of them. The pupils will learn through a range of activities; games, role play, songs and quizzes. Comprehension and listening exercises will also be used and correct grammar will be encouraged in written work.	'The journey of life and death'. The pupils reflect on how life can be viewed as a journey, recognise important milestones and understand the importance of hope. The pupils then learn how to consider broader human responses to death and bereavement before studying and comparing rituals and beliefs across different faiths, including Christianity, Buddhism,	Me and My Relationships: The pupils will learn how to be assertive and what it means to be an active or a passive bystander. They will also learn how to compromise and negotiate in a range of scenarios. Lastly, they will learn about appropriate and inappropriate and inappropriate touch, and how to help themselves and others. Valuing Difference: The pupils will learn how to recognise and reflect on prejudice-based behaviour, linking behaviours to their previous learning of active and passive bystanding.	Indoor PE: Indoor PE lessons focus on gymnastics, where the pupils choreograph their own routines, using the skills they learned and developed in previous years. Outdoor PE: During their outdoor PE lessons at Hurlingham Park, Year 6 pupils will have the opportunity to choose between football and netball. In football pupils will refine their dribbling, passing and shooting techniques while learning how to support play off the ball and transition between attack and defence. In netball pupils will build on their passing accuracy, footwork and shooting, while exploring defensive strategies and movement within zones. Match play will include structured team roles and basic tactical formations,	In music this term we will learn about accidentals, the major scale and have an introduction to key signatures. The pupils will also explore the orchestra with Benjamin Britten. The pupils will also have weekly choir practice with Year 5, learning a range of songs from well-known productions to seasonal classics ready for the Christmas carol concert.	Year 6 will be learning about a variety of artists and analysing their artwork. The artists include J. M. W. Turner, Van Eyck, van Gogh, Frida Kahlo and others. They will be learning about their lives, influences and techniques they used.

How can I help at home?

Talk to your child about current affairs, encourage them to read and prepare book reviews all to prepare them for interviews.
