We will learn about animal words and expressions. We will see vocabulary for places and family members. We will talk about the holidays and learn summer vocabulary and what we do during this season. Every week we will do action-chants and sing songs. We will play different games and activities to learn and practise the new vocabulary.	The children will explore religious stories from around the world, carefully drawing comparisons and inferring the moral of each story. Year 2 will then learn about Islam and the traditions and religious events that the Islamic faith follow.	In PSHCE Year 2 will consider how to be their best in terms of caring for their hygiene and looking after their bodies. They will then consider ways in which they are changing and consider their physical growth and changes in their bodies, as well as their personal growth. They will learn the correct terminology for parts of the body.	During outdoor PE lessons, the children will be playing cricket. They will be batting, bowling and fielding in preparation for their cricket fixtures. The children will also be doing athletics, where they will develop skills required in athletic activities, such as running at different speeds, changing direction, jumping and throwing. The children will also be practising for their sports day at the end of the year.	In music the children will learn about rests, write rhythm duets and have a musical maths quiz. We will continue to compose for our chosen animal, and we will play games with pitch and dynamics. In choir we will prepare for the summer concert.	In art we will be looking at the painting 'Surprised' by Henri Rousseau and creating artwork around the themes of this painting. The children will be experimenting with collage, painting and print this term.

How can I help at home?

The Year 2 curriculum sees the children finish their Pre-prep journey and this term focuses on preparing pupils for Prep. Children will continue to be encouraged to be autonomous learners and to demonstrate independence in thinking, problem-solving and caring for themselves. Please encourage your child to take responsibility for their belongings, learn to tie their laces, to learn their times tables and to help around the home, for example to share their recycling expertise. Continue to encourage your children to read and broaden their reading to include a range of text types. Reading comprehension is an increasing focus, so please do ask questions when you read at home. Continue to encourage your child to learn their times tables and to read the clock to the nearest five minutes. Providing your child with their own learning watch or clock would support this learning.
